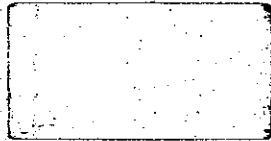

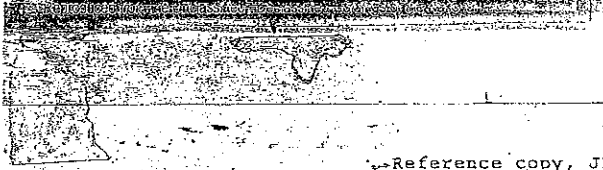

Interview of Elmer L. Boyd, 50 yrs., D.O.B. 9/21/27.  
 2649 Crestridge Drive, Dallas. 328-4926. Interviewed at  
 his home by Harold A. Rose. 25 yrs. on Dallas P.D. - Crime  
 against Person Section.

On Nov. 22, 1963, E.L. Boyd was assigned to the Homicide  
 Squad. In company with Captain Will Fritz and Detective  
 Richard Sims, they were assigned to the security of the head  
 table for the Presidential luncheon at the Dallas Trade Mart.  
 While at the Trade Mart, they were told that the President  
 was due in five minutes. While doing a final check on the  
 head table, Chief Stevenson told them that the President had  
 been hurt at the triple underpass. He called the dispatcher  
 office and was told that the President had been shot. Capt. Fritz  
 Sims and Boyd went to Parkland Hospital but when they got  
 to the outside of Parkland, Chief Curry sent them to the  
 T.S.B.D. They went into the T.S.B.D. and within several  
 minutes, all employees had been accounted for except Lee  
 Harvey Oswald. While they were on the sixth floor, the empty  
 hulls and rifle were found. They were getting ready to go  
 to Irving to an address that they had on Oswald, when they

heard about J.D. Tippit getting shot. They called their office and Lieut. Baker answered and told them that the man that shot Tippit had been apprehended. Boyd asked the man's name, Lt. Baker left the phone to check and came back and said it was Lee Harvey Oswald. Capt. Fritz, Sims and Boyd came directly to the Homicide Office.

Boyd stated that he recalls being present during approximately six interrogations of Oswald. He and Sims would transfer Oswald from the Office to the lock up on each occasion. He stated that the F.B.I. and other agencies insisted on being present during the interrogations and Chief Curry consented. Either Sims or Boyd were always present during these interrogations. Boyd stated that the notes he took were transposed in to the report that he made and the Warren Commission had his report.

He stated that Oswald was very arrogant. He denied owning any gun. When he was shown the picture of him holding the rifle, he said it was trick photography. He talked some about being in Russia. He got real upset when Hosty came in. Oswald said that Hosty has "accasted" his wife, Marina. Oswald denied shooting the President and also denied shooting Tippit. Boyd said that Capt. Fritz couldn't conduct proper interrogations because of the amount of people present, but had no choice.

Boyd knew Jack Ruby and had seen him around. There were a lot of people present during the Ruby interrogation also. Jack Ruby said that he felt that he had done the country a favor. He was cooperative and did not have an arrogant attitude.

Boyd was not working during the transfer of Oswald and Oswald's shooting.
